

THIS WEEK'S BIG READ: HIEROGLYPHICS

Hieroglyphics, the ancient Egyptian writing system, is a language which uses pictures to represent words and ideas. You can still see hieroglyphics on temple walls, tombs and papyrus (ancient Egyptian paper). It includes up to 5,000 images of animals, objects and symbols.

While the emojis that we use today are simple enough to understand, hieroglyphics are incredibly complex. When the Rosetta Stone was discovered in 1799, scholars were able to translate hieroglyphics for the first time. This allowed people to learn more about ancient Egypt.
